Internal & Governance
Volunteer Digital Champion NEoN is also promoting the importance of sharing the necessary computer skills to help people get online. As more services become digitised and as the online world gets more complicated, sharing basic knowledge about getting on and staying safe online can increase digital inclusion.
NEoN is a <u>digital champion</u> and is looking to develop a collaborative digital inclusion programme by encouraging more people that can to become volunteer Digital Champions. A volunteer Digital Champion is someone who supports family, friends, colleagues, customers or people in the community to enjoy all the benefits that having Essential Digital Skills can bring.
NEONS Digital Charter NEON is a signatory of Scotland's <u>Digital Participation Charter</u> and has been for the last 4 years. Scotland's Digital Participation Charter encourages organisations to pledge their commitment to improving digital inclusion across Scotland. Organisations that sign the Charter are asked to commit to the Charter's five pledges and to contribute commitments of their own before being accepted as signatories.
Change of Bank to CAF Bank - NEoN has banked with Santander since it officially constituted as a charity in 2012. They offered the best rates and gave us access to great online banking management. We joined having made no consideration of Santander's mission or values, whether these matched or contradicted our values, whether Santander had any long-term commitment to helping humans or the environment, and so on. Subconsciously, we knew if we looked closely at this, Santander's banking practices may not be aligned with our values as an organisation or be morally aligned to our staff's personal views. This always felt problematic. So we secured a new account with CAF Bank.
Accessibility Strategy - This year, NEoN committed to exploring and implementing more accessible options across the 2021 festival programme. As a consequence, we employed our first Accessibility Officer, who advised on all events and activities delivered. This work has extended to writing a new

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accessibility strategy. To be published in late summer 2022. <u>https://neondigitalarts.com/event/festival-information/</u> All events in our programme had a clear 'Access' section which identifies any additional support systems that are in place. We designed an 'Access Key' as a useful navigational tool to help identify which projects you may be interested in.
NEoN developed and implemented a Comfort Ryder to its Tech Ryder it used with artists to ascertain programming requirements - this is to better understand the accessibility requirement of all the people we work with. This still requires development in continued collaboration with artists, curators and any other participants.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

Change in basis of accounting or to previous accounts

There has been no change to the accounting policies (valuation rules and method of accounting) since last year and no changes have been made to accounts for previous years.

Fund accounting	
Unrestricted funds	These are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity.
Designated funds	These are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.
Revaluation funds	These are unrestricted funds which include a revaluation reserve representing the restatement of investment assets at their market values.
Restricted funds	These are available for use subject to restrictions imposed by the donor or through terms of an appeal.
Income	
Recognition of income	Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to, and virtually certain to receive, the income and the amount of the income can be measured with sufficient reliability.
Income with related expenditure	Where income has related expenditure the income and related expenditure is reported gross in the SoFA.
Donations and legacies	Voluntary income received by way of grants, donations and gifts is included in the the SoFA when receivable and only when the Charity has unconditional entitlement to the income.
Tax reclaims on donations and gifts	Income from tax reclaims is included in the SoFA at the same time as the gift/donation to which it relates.
Donated services and facilities	These are only included in income (with an equivalent amount in expenditure) where the benefit to the Charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material.
Volunteer help	The value of any volunteer help received is not included in the accounts.
Investment income	This is included in the accounts wher receivable.
Gains/(losses) on revaluation of fixed assets	This includes any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.
Gains/(losses) on investment assets	This includes any gain or loss on the sale of investments.

Expenditure	
Recognition of expenditure	Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.
Expenditure on raising funds	These comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income, fundraising trading costs and investment management costs.
Expenditure on	These comprise the costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities and
charitable activities	services in the furtherance of its objects, including the making of grants and governance costs.
Grants payable	All grant expenditure is accounted for on an actual paid basis plus an accrual for grants that have been approved by the trustees at the end of the year but not yet paid.
Governance costs	These include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the Charity, including any audit/independent examination fees, costs linked to the strategic management of the Charity, together with a share of other administration costs.
Other expenditure	These are support costs not allocated to a particular activity.

Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the statement of financial position, bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings or current liabilities. In the Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the company's cash management.

Trade and other creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for nay trade discounts due.
